MU worked very hard this week to get 36 locations tested (most ever) and got it to us early.

Locations tested include:

Rolla, KC, Springfield, Cassville, Neosho, Monett, Joplin, Charleston, Fulton, Milan, St. Peters, Jefferson City, NPSDS, Joplin, St. Louis, Warrensburg, Southwest City, Columbia, St. Joseph, Independence, Brookfield, Mexico, Marshfield, Macon, Bolivar, Eldon, Liberty, KC, Memphis, St Charles county, Marceline, and Chilicothe

All 36 WWTFs we tested this week contained the Delta variant. Keep in mind that this does not mean that the variant is everywhere. We are only sequencing places with enough RNA level for us to do this analysis. There are still many areas where the RNA levels are quite low.

13 locations contained a combination of variants.

It is still my plan to update the storymap with this variant data on Tuesday.

These percentages have shown up on Facebook. The one I know of is Matthew Holloway. This science and data is very new and it is easy to inaccurately interpret or use it in ways that are not supported by science. It also should not be used to compare one location to another. We are currently working with CDC to determine ways to further the use of this data.

Sherry – can you confirm the stats in paragraph 2 as I know Ed is anxious to talk to the media ASAP using this info. This can be an evergreen document so feel free to keep sending thoughts and additions.

There are many differing views of the pandemic and its implications; one thing we can all agree on is the importance of keeping our community safe. We need everybody's help to do that.

In Livingston County, 39% of Livingston County residents over age 18 are vaccinated. And 67% of those over 65 are vaccinated. This makes us 20th in the state of Missouri for vaccinations.

A few points to consider:

- 1. While there may be some exceptions, studies show that vaccines are effective in preventing Covid-19. Our county's best shot at combating the pandemic is to get the majority of our residents vaccinated.
 - a. As more people in our community become vaccinated against Covid-19, the virus will have fewer people to infect and transmission will naturally go down. Every person that gets vaccinated brings us one step closer to defeating this virus.

Good morning,

I am emailing to let you know we have seen what we may consider a significant increase or elevation in SARS-CoV-2 genetic material in a sewershed collection location in your area (Neosho, St. Joseph, Bolivar, and Memphis wastewater treatment facilities). The viral load concentrations at Marceline and Chillicothe were also high. Please refer to Box.com or BI Portal to look at this data.

This is a developing science, so there is not a lot we can guarantee these results mean. The correlations we have been able to do to this point show that a significant increase in viral load is followed 4 to 6 days later with an increase (at least 25%) in positive human cases approximately 70% of the time. As with any model, we do not recommend using sewershed data alone in decision making; however, it may be a useful piece of information along with other data sources. Feel free to contact us with any questions or concerns.

Using wastewater testing to investigate COVID-19 virus variants in Missouri

Please see the message below from Jeff Wenzel, Chief of the Bureau of Environmental Epidemiology.

As many of you know, DHSS has been working with the University of Missouri-Columbia and the Department of Natural Resources on one of the DHSS surveillance priorities: Coronavirus Sewershed Surveillance Project. In February of this year, this team was one of the first in the nation to begin viral sequence monitoring of wastewater samples, which allows for identification of variant viruses in the sewage. While not highly prevalent, the analysis indicates the B.1.1.7 variant is present in samples collected from throughout the state. 15 of the 23 communities tested showed small amounts (often a fraction of a percent) of genetic material containing mutations consistent with the B.1.1.7 variant.

The "South California" variant was also seen in most sewersheds in Missouri. While it is interesting to the sewershed team that we were able to see multiple variants, the role of this particular variant in the overall epidemic is not clearly understood yet. Human cases of "South California" variant have been reported in many states, including Missouri.

At this time, we do not know if these low variant virus levels will continue to increase. There is no clear association with increasing human cases of variant virus in Missouri, but as we are ramping up our sequencing capacity at the SPHL, we may see more human cases in Missouri.

The second round of sequencing of sewershed samples is currently being submitted. Results of this sample should be available in about 2 weeks.
