Public Health Testing at Work

The County Public Health Department can come to you! Talk to your employer about bringing testing to your workplace. Public Health will only collect your name, date of birth and contact information so they can let you know your test results. Employers can request testing at their workplace by calling (805) 781-5500.

CHC Testing

Community Health Centers (CHC) is waiving all costs for medically necessary screening and testing for COVID-19 (coronavirus). Visit **www.communityhealthcenters.org** or call (866) 614-4636.

How does testing work?

- ✓ **Pick a location.** Depending on the testing location, you can either walk in or you may have to make an appointment.
- ✓ Show up. A health care worker will greet you and swab the inside of your nose. The test should take a few minutes from start to finish.
- ✓ Get your results. It can take anywhere from 1 to 6 days to get your test results, depending on where you get tested.

If you test positive, you may not be able to work until you're well. But there is help available during that time.

Get Paid When Sick

Even if you test positive for coronavirus and cannot work, you can still get paid. Food sector workers and agriculture workers - including farm workers and growers - may qualify for up to two weeks of paid sick leave for COVID-19 related reasons (part-time workers may not get the full 80 hours).

Get Lodging and Food When Sick

The County of San Luis Obispo can help coordinate lodging and food to support any farm workers diagnosed with COVID-19. County staff will work with farm workers or their employers to get temporary housing to ensure the safety and well-being of the farm worker and their housemates. Good morning,

Wow, Paulina had a lot of great ideas and insights (see below). The point she makes about the growers being more trusted than an unknown third party makes a lot sense too. If any are willing to host testing or have the facility for it. Thinking through the logistics might be worthwhile should one of their staff become infected and it be necessary to test everyone as art of a containment plan.

Leo added this regarding a testing location: Georgia Brown Elem is also a "trusted institution" as it is where most families send their littles ones to school so they might be a good alternative site if others don't work out.

From Leo on marketing and promotion: But wherever the site ends up being (great recommendations from Paulina), it would be wise to reach out to the schools in the area (Flamson, Georgia Brown, High School) and connect with the housing complexes (Oak Park [PR Housing Authority], Presidio Gardens, Laguna Terrace, etc) and ask them to help promote the testing site. And if possible, blast it on the radio and local Spanish news channels (if not being done already).

Let me know if I should follow up with any potential sites. Paulina offers to connect us with a person in charge of a community room through housing authority.

Good morning Francine and Leo,

Sorry to come in so late into the conversation. But, yes I agree with Leo about testing in north Paso Robles.

That being said, I right away I thought about a Mexican meat market (Carniceria La Barata) on Spring and 34th street. That market is very popular in the Latino community and frequently used by the large farm working community that lives around there. The different apartment complexes and housing units in the vicinity (especially the Paso Robles Housing Authority- locally known as Oak Park), house farmworkers. There are other businesses in the little strip where the meat market is location. There might even be some free space, but I am not sure who to contact.

Another option is to talk with the Paso Robles Housing Authority (901 30th Street) and see if they would be open to hosting the testing site. They have a community room that is pretty spacious. They hold a lot of events there including their food distributions. The oral health program has a contact- her name is Betian Webb (bwebb@pasoroblesha.org; 805-674-4413 cell).

One last comment- I did not get to read the document and I completely understand the growers' concerns, but if anything they are best avenue for hosting pop-up testing sites. The workers trust them, their employers more than they trust us or a third party. Maybe the growers are mostly concerned of what can happen if a good number of their employees test positive.

I hope this helps and if you would like me to connect you to Betian let me know.



Do you think you may have been exposed to Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19)? You can get tested for free, even if you don't have symptoms.



How to Get Tested



What happens if your test comes back positive?

Public Health Testing at Work

The County Public Health Department can come to you! Talk to your employer about bringing testing to your workplace. Public Health will only collect your name, date of birth and contact information so they can let you know your test results. Employers can request testing at their workplace by calling (805) 781-5500.

CHC Testing

Community Health Centers (CHC) is waiving all costs for medically necessary screening and testing for COVID-19 (coronavirus). Visit **www.communityhealthcenters.org** or call (866) 614-4636.

How does testing work?

- ✓ **Pick a location.** Depending on the testing location, you can either walk in or you may have to make an appointment.
- ✓ Show up. A health care worker will greet you and swab the inside of your nose. The test should take a few minutes from start to finish.
- ✓ Get your results. It can take anywhere from 1 to 6 days to get your test results, depending on where you get tested.

If you test positive, you may not be able to work until you're well. But there is help available during that time.

Get Paid When Sick

Even if you test positive for coronavirus and cannot work, you can still get paid. Food sector workers and agriculture workers - including farm workers and growers - may qualify for up to two weeks of paid sick leave for COVID-19 related reasons (part-time workers may not get the full 80 hours).

Get Lodging and Food When Sick

The County of San Luis Obispo can help coordinate lodging and food to support any farm workers diagnosed with COVID-19. County staff will work with farm workers or their employers to get temporary housing to ensure the safety and well-being of the farm worker and their housemates. Most of us in Med/Health spoke with Marty this morning as a follow up to our last call. We propose the following COVID Migrant Worker Plan:

- 1. Develop information on COVID testing for Ag Dept to distribute to growers associations
 - a. PIO developing today and will send to Marty for input.
 - b. Marty will distribute to grower associate email list, post on website and PIOs will post on ReadySLO
- 2. Request input from growers on availability of testing for their staff; coordinate to provide pop up testing at worksite, housing location or nearby community location.
 - a. Marty will provide grower feedback to Med/Health
 - b. Med/Health will coordinate testing locations
- 3. With approval from EOC, offer County motel program to ag growers for use if they have workers that need to be quarantined or isolated and is unable to do so in current housing.
 - a. If approved, Med/Health will develop process instructions (similar to homeless process) for Marty to distribute to growers

At this point, most of the ag workers are working in South County. Come fall, the work will shift to SLO and North County for grape harvest.

Let me know if this plan will work for you and Wade or if we need to adjust anything—particularly the motel program piece..

Hi Penny,

I have been having a number of conversations over the past few days with the ag industry. Here is a summary of what I have learne:

- 1. By law all employers are required to provide 3 days of sick leave to their employees, including farm labor. Since COVID arrived, farm labor has been provided 14 days of sick leave (based on certain criteria) for business with 500 or fewer employees under federal law. State law requires employers to provide 14 days of sick leave for farm labor where there are 500 or more employees. So, farm labor is protected just as other workers are.
- 2. From my conversations with the industry, it is a mixed bag related to testing. Some would welcome more testing, while others would rather see more information about testing. The additional information they would like to see is:
 - a. The type of testing available
 - b. The accuracy of the testing
 - c. The criteria for testing
 - d. Locations for testing
 - e. Hours of operation

- f. Directory of local resources clinics, home health care, on-site testing, telemedicine. I think it would be beneficial to provide some outreach specific to the ag community outlining this information. If additional testing were to be provided (pop up testing), I think we would want to do something in South County, SLO and North County. I know North County seems to have a higher concentration of positive tests, so it may be a good idea to do it up there.
- 3. Most of our fieldworkers are already here. Most of the individuals are year round laborers and the only influx is our guest laborers being brought in under the H2A program and that has already happened. So, there should not be a significant influx of farm labor past this point. In the fall, we may see a shift of labor to wine grapes and away from row crops or we may see a decline in numbers.
- 4. I have spoken with Kelly V. and the information I sent you yesterday regarding fieldworker guidance should be posted in the agriculture portion on ReadySLO.org.

I will be giving an update at the press briefing on Wednesday and I don't plan to address any of these issues specifically as it seems it would be premature. I will however provide information about the 54,000 masks we have to distribute. Basically, I will be providing the same information that was in my article you reviewed last week.

Please let me know if I missed any information you need or if we can help in any way. We are standing by.

Penny,

I have been reaching out to various contacts regarding benefits for farm labor. There is a mandatory 14 days of Employer Paid Sick Leave for farmworkers. Additionally, there is a program, similar to FMLA, that becomes active after 30 days of employment. So, that being said, there is a cushion for farmworkers if they become sick due to COVID. Also, I am hearing from some of our larger growers, who hire and retain their own labor, that they have established a means to isolate workers should they become infected. I can't say that this is across the board, but it there has been some proactive actions taken by some growers.

So far, I am hearing that more testing would be welcome and we have been offered a site at the Farm Bureau office in SLO. I know we would need one in south county as well, as that is the highest concentration of farmworkers. One thing to keep in mind is that these testing sites would have to be flexible to accommodate the schedule of farmworkers such as being open early, late and possibly on weekends. I will dig deeper and have more info for you soon.

Most of us in Med/Health spoke with Marty this morning as a follow up to our last call. We propose the following COVID Migrant Worker Plan:

- 1. Develop information on COVID testing for Ag Dept to distribute to growers associations
 - a. PIO developing today and will send to Marty for input.
 - b. Marty will distribute to grower associate email list, post on website and PIOs will post on ReadySLO
- 2. Request input from growers on availability of testing for their staff; coordinate to provide pop up testing at worksite, housing location or nearby community location.
 - a. Marty will provide grower feedback to Med/Health
 - b. Med/Health will coordinate testing locations
- 3. With approval from EOC, offer County motel program to ag growers for use if they have workers that need to be quarantined or isolated and is unable to do so in current housing.
 - a. If approved, Med/Health will develop process instructions (similar to homeless process) for Marty to distribute to growers

At this point, most of the ag workers are working in South County. Come fall, the work will shift to SLO and North County for grape harvest.

Let me know if this plan will work for you and Wade or if we need to adjust anything—particularly the motel program piece..

Hi Penny,

I have been having a number of conversations over the past few days with the ag industry. Here is a summary of what I have learne:

1. By law all employers are required to provide 3 days of sick leave to their employees, including farm labor. Since COVID arrived, farm labor has been provided 14 days of sick leave (based on certain criteria) for business with 500 or fewer employees under federal law. State law requires employers to provide 14 days of sick leave for farm labor where there are 500 or more employees. So, farm labor is protected just as other workers are.

- 2. From my conversations with the industry, it is a mixed bag related to testing. Some would welcome more testing, while others would rather see more information about testing. The additional information they would like to see is:
 - a. The type of testing available
 - b. The accuracy of the testing
 - c. The criteria for testing
 - d. Locations for testing
 - e. Hours of operation
 - f. Directory of local resources clinics, home health care, on-site testing, telemedicine.

I think it would be beneficial to provide some outreach specific to the ag community outlining this information. If additional testing were to be provided (pop up testing), I think we would want to do something in South County, SLO and North County. I know North County seems to have a higher concentration of positive tests, so it may be a good idea to do it up there.

- 3. Most of our fieldworkers are already here. Most of the individuals are year round laborers and the only influx is our guest laborers being brought in under the H2A program and that has already happened. So, there should not be a significant influx of farm labor past this point. In the fall, we may see a shift of labor to wine grapes and away from row crops or we may see a decline in numbers.
- 4. I have spoken with Kelly V. and the information I sent you yesterday regarding fieldworker guidance should be posted in the agriculture portion on ReadySLO.org.

I will be giving an update at the press briefing on Wednesday and I don't plan to address any of these issues specifically as it seems it would be premature. I will however provide information about the 54,000 masks we have to distribute. Basically, I will be providing the same information that was in my article you reviewed last week.

Please let me know if I missed any information you need or if we can help in any way. We are standing by.

Penny,

I have been reaching out to various contacts regarding benefits for farm labor. There is a mandatory 14 days of Employer Paid Sick Leave for farmworkers. Additionally, there is a program, similar to FMLA, that becomes active after 30 days of employment. So, that being said, there is a cushion for farmworkers if they become sick due to COVID. Also, I am hearing from some of our larger growers, who hire and retain their own labor, that they have established a means to isolate workers should they become infected. I can't say that this is across the board, but it there has been some proactive actions taken by some growers.

So far, I am hearing that more testing would be welcome and we have been offered a site at the Farm Bureau office in SLO. I know we would need one in south county as well, as that is the highest concentration of farmworkers. One thing to keep in mind is that these testing sites would have to be flexible to accommodate the schedule of farmworkers such as being open early, late and possibly on weekends. I will dig deeper and have more info for you soon.

SUMMARY OF THE SLO COUNTY AG DEPARTMENT'S DIRECT OUTREACH TO LOCAL AG BUSINESSES AND FARM LABOR CONTRACTORS (June 10, 2020)

1. **QUESTION**: Do your employees know that they can get a free COVID test at Community Health Centers throughout SLO County?

RESPONSE: Responses were mixed. Well over half of the businesses contacted understood that COVID tests were widely available and felt that their employees were also aware of those tests. However, there was still a significant number of businesses contacted (roughly 40%) that were not aware of the testing and didn't think their employees were aware either. There weren't any easily identifiable trends, based on geography (e.g. North County vs South County based businesses) or ag industry sectors or business size, of which businesses were aware or unaware of testing availability.

ACTION ITEM FOR THE AG DEPARTMENT: Most businesses are aware of the testing availability, but many are not. We will take the next few weeks and do our best to distribute that information to both businesses and workers.

- Distribute brochures completed last week to growers and businesses via email and other online distribution methods.
- Provide hard copies to workers while we are in the field and conducting inspections and other work unrelated to COVID. We will print those brochures ourselves in-house.

POTENTIAL ACTION ITEM FOR OTHERS: In order to reach the workers directly, it would be really helpful to put together some kind of public awareness campaign on local Spanish language radio, if that is not already being conducted.

2. **QUESTION**: Would your employees be more likely to get tested if the County ran a free "pop-up" testing site at a local farm, vineyard, or other site on a pre-arranged day? If the answer is yes, do you have any ideas on a good location to hold that kind of testing event?

RESPONSE: Most businesses that we spoke to felt that many of the workers would get tested if there was a testing site that was convenient and that they were familiar with. For example, if you held a testing site near the same grocery stores, pharmacies, or doctor's office that these workers use on a routine basis, they would be more inclined to take advantage of that option. Interestingly, although I suppose not surprisingly, some businesses noted that it would be mostly females and children that would take advantage of the free testing and that you'd have a lower percentage of the male workers getting tested.

The most consistent message we received from businesses is that they do NOT want to host testing events at local farms or ranches. There are a lot of perception issues that could stem from those types of events that businesses had concerns about, such as the concern many of their workers would have by bringing "the government" on to their job sites, the sense that it would appear to be mandatory for all of their workers if the testing was done at a work location, etc.

There were a couple of exceptions to that response from businesses that would be interested in hosting a test site. I believe the reason for that is that they are in the nursery industry, which tends to employ a more stable, long-term work force. I will reach out to those two companies myself and get some details on how many

employees they have and if a pop-up testing event was held, would they be willing to open it up to other workers outside of their own employees?

ACTION ITEM FOR THE AG DEPARTMENT: Although most businesses were adamant that the testing sites do not take place on a local farm or ranch, there were a couple that welcomed that possibility. We will reach out to those businesses to obtain further information on the potential logistics of hosting an event.

POTENTIAL ACTION ITEM FOR OTHERS: Determine potential locations in North County for a possible pop-up testing site. Is there an Hispanic market or other local business that is used frequently by farm workers where a testing event could be held?

3. **QUESTION**: If one of your employee's contracts COVID, have you already made arrangements for a place that they can stay that is separated from their co-workers?

RESPONSE: Answers to this question varied greatly and tended to vary based on the size of the business. Large operations generally have made some pre-arrangements, smaller businesses had not, and were simply instructing any sick workers to self-quarantine at home.

It's important to realize that ag workers fall into a variety of different legal categories. One fairly commonly used program is the H2A visa. Under that program, the employer is sponsoring the employee and is legally required to provide housing, so these businesses have typically made some alternate housing arrangements in case they're needed. Those workers that are here under the H2A program tend to work in row crops or strawberries and are working for the larger companies, mostly located in the southern part of the county (and often with workers residing in Santa Barbara County).

Otherwise, the employees are typically responsible for their own housing. So, if they aren't here under the H2A program, then they would be living with family or other co-workers. These are the people who could have the most trouble isolating if they were to contract COVID-19, and they would not be likely to utilize the housing arrangements unless it was paid for by the County. Their employers would not generally be willing to pay for those accommodations either since they are not responsible for their living/housing situation under normal circumstances.

Since many of our agricultural workers reside in either Santa Barbara or Monterey County, I don't have a good sense of how much this housing program will be needed and/or utilized.

ACTION ITEM FOR THE AG DEPARTMENT: We will do our best to inform businesses and workers regarding the availability of housing for those sick with COVID utilizing the same methods discussed in #1. If there are any Spanish language public service announcements conducted, then it would be helpful to include information about this housing availability in that outreach campaign.

Migrant Worker COVID Plan

Objective: Reduce COVID transmission in migrant worker population, which is at higher risk for COVID-19.

Need: Migrant workers are at higher risk for COVID-19 due to their lower socio-economic status. They often live and work closely together, which increases opportunities for transmission. They may work while ill because they cannot afford to lose wages. Further, some do not have health insurance, which is a barrier to seeking medical care.

Strategy: Increase testing among migrant worker community to identify and isolate positive cases quickly in order to stop transmission of COVID-19.

- Conduct targeted awareness campaigns to address barriers to getting tested: availability of testing, fear of being positive because of lost wages and lack of isolated housing.
- Offer to conduct PH Surveillance program testing onsite at worksites and housing complexes to/ increase accessibility and reduce number of personal data points required for testing (which has been identified as a barrier to testing). Public Health has grant from CDPH to conduct respiratory surveillance that pays for staff time and lab testing materials, therefore PH does not bill patient's insurance and requires less personally identifiable information.
- Lodge positive patients in need of housing to maintain isolation order in County-contracted motels. Employer will pay motel fees if able, otherwise County will pay for motel and seek FEMA reimbursement through homeless act or Project Room Key.

Tasks:

- Develop flyer for Ag Dept to disseminate to ag industry growers and associations. [Text drafted 5/29/2020; PIO working on design for Ag Dept to disseminate week of 6/1/2020]
- Consider working with Promotores to conduct farm worker outreach. [Emailed Marc at Ag to determine if Ag Dept works with Promotores before proceeding 5/29/2020]
- Disseminate process for Communicable Disease workers to refer migrant workers to housing coordinator for motel programs to Ops Section Chief, Care and Shelter Branch, Med/Health Branch and Liaison. [Process drafted by Lodging Coordinator and edits provided Med/Health. Will be disseminated week of 6/1/2020].
- Schedule PH pop up clinics at farm worker worksites and housing complexes as requested. [Public Health staff available for pop up clinics immediately]
- Inform cities via Cities EOC Call of program. [OES to provide update to Cities week of 6/1/2020 or once PH pop up clinics are scheduled)

How to Get Tested Public Health Testing at Work

The County Public Health Department can come to you! Talk to your employer about bringing testing to your workplace. Public Health will only collect your name, date of birth and contact information so they can let you know your test results. Employers can request testing at their workplace by calling (805) 781-5500.

Community Health Centers (CHC) Testing

How does testing work?

- ✓ Pick a location. Depending on the testing location, you can either walk in to get tested immediately or you may have to make an appointment.
- Show up. A health care worker will greet you and swab the inside of your nose. The test should take a few minutes from start to finish.
- ✓ Get your results. It can take anywhere from 1 to 6 days to get your test results, depending on where you get tested.

Proposed Process for Migrant Worker Testing and Sheltering

- 1. The Public Health Nurse and/or case investigator will conduct a case investigation for patients that test positive for COVID.
- 2. If the patient does not feel able to isolate in their normal living situation, the Public Health nurse will contact the Lodging Coordinator (805-781-1061) or Sharon Lovelady (805-781-4857).
- 3. The Lodging Coordinator will work with the patient's employer to determine who will pay for the patient's lodging. Employer may use the County's motel contract to house patient but will take over payment of motel. If employer is unable to pay for lodging, Lodging Coordinator will determine if patient is eligible for County lodging programs: either homeless lodging or Project Room Key.
- 4. The Lodging Coordinator will start the process already established at the EOC. Food and regular checks by Public Health Nurses and Behavioral Health.
- 5. Lodging Coordinator will notify Homeless Services Team for possible case management.
- 6. If meals need to be provided the lodging coordinator will confirm food delivery for new guest (dietary restrictions, medications, and other Important information).

Transportation Process if Necessary

- 1. Lodging Coordinator will contact the Hotel in the geographic area that the individual lives.
- 2. Lodging Coordinator will notify the Transport Driver if the guest has any mobility issues that would require accommodations.
- 3. Transportation driver will transport guest to the hotel with limited property (up to 2 bags).
- 4. Transportation Driver will complete all forms and return to Sharon Lovelady.
- 5. The individual should understand that placement in the Hotel means that he or she must stay in the Hotel until cleared from isolation.

Daily Medical Checks

- 1. Public Health Nurse will have a face to face visit or phone call with the guest.
- 2. Public Health Nurse will call Lodging Coordinator with updates.
- 3. Lodging Coordinator will update the Access Tracker.
- 4. If Case management is needed, they will contact each guest three times per day.
 - a. If a guest does not respond a call to the Hotel staff will be made to do a welfare check.
- 5. Lodging coordinator will process and enter all documents from check in procedure.
- 6. Lodging Coordinator will provide Dr. Rosen, Sheriff, Christine Gaiger with occupancy list of current guest's and guest's that will be discharged that day.

Discharge Plan

- 1. Public Health Nurse will contact the Lodging Coordinator to start the discharge plan when the guest is all clear.
- 2. Lodging Coordinator will contact the Hotel to notify of guest being checked out.
- 3. Lodging Coordinator will contact the transportation staff to arrange pick up from Hotel back to where they were transported from.
- 4. Transportation staff will complete the discharge checklist.
- 5. After release, the participant will be provided transportation back to the location they were originally picked up from.

Wow, Paulina had a lot of great ideas and insights (see below). The point she makes about the growers being more trusted than an unknown third party makes a lot sense too. If any are willing to host testing or have the facility for it. Thinking through the logistics might be worthwhile should one of their staff become infected and it be necessary to test everyone as art of a containment plan.

Leo added this regarding a testing location: Georgia Brown Elem is also a "trusted institution" as it is where most families send their littles ones to school so they might be a good alternative site if others don't work out.

From Leo on marketing and promotion: But wherever the site ends up being (great recommendations from Paulina), it would be wise to reach out to the schools in the area (Flamson, Georgia Brown, High School) and connect with the housing complexes (Oak Park [PR Housing Authority], Presidio Gardens, Laguna Terrace, etc) and ask them to help promote the testing site. And if possible, blast it on the radio and local Spanish news channels (if not being done already).

Let me know if I should follow up with any potential sites. Paulina offers to connect us with a person in charge of a community room through housing authority.

Good morning Francine and Leo,

Sorry to come in so late into the conversation. But, yes I agree with Leo about testing in north Paso Robles.

That being said, I right away I thought about a Mexican meat market (Carniceria La Barata) on Spring and 34th street. That market is very popular in the Latino community and frequently used by the large farm working community that lives around there. The different apartment complexes and housing units in the vicinity (especially the Paso Robles Housing Authority- locally known as Oak Park), house farmworkers. There are other businesses in the little strip where the meat market is location. There might even be some free space, but I am not sure who to contact.

Another option is to talk with the Paso Robles Housing Authority (901 30th Street) and see if they would be open to hosting the testing site. They have a community room that is pretty spacious. They hold a lot of events there including their food distributions. The oral health program has a contact- her name is Betian Webb (bwebb@pasoroblesha.org; 805-674-4413 cell).

One last comment- I did not get to read the document and I completely understand the growers' concerns, but if anything they are best avenue for hosting pop-up testing sites. The workers trust them, their employers more than they trust us or a third party. Maybe the growers are mostly concerned of what can happen if a good number of their employees test positive.

I hope this helps and if you would like me to connect you to Betian let me know.

If any are willing to host testing or have the facility for it. Thinking through the logistics might be worthwhile should one of their staff become infected and it be necessary to test everyone as art of a containment plan.

Leo added this regarding a testing location: Georgia Brown Elem is also a "trusted institution" as it is where most families send their littles ones to school so they might be a good alternative site if others don't work out.

From Leo on marketing and promotion: But wherever the site ends up being (great recommendations from Paulina), it would be wise to reach out to the schools in the area (Flamson, Georgia Brown, High School) and connect with the housing complexes (Oak Park [PR Housing Authority], Presidio Gardens, Laguna Terrace, etc) and ask them to help promote the testing site. Sorry to come in so late into the conversation. But, yes I agree with Leo about testing in north Paso Robles.

That being said, I right away I thought about a Mexican meat market (Carniceria La Barata) on Spring and 34th street. That market is very popular in the Latino community and frequently used by the large farm working community that lives around there. The different apartment complexes and housing units in the vicinity (especially the Paso Robles Housing Authority- locally known as Oak Park), house farmworkers. There are other businesses in the little strip where the meat market is location. There might even be some free space, but I am not sure who to contact.

Another option is to talk with the Paso Robles Housing Authority (901 30th Street) and see if they would be open to hosting the testing site. They have a community room that is pretty spacious. They hold a lot of events there including their food distributions. The oral health program has a contact- her name is Betian Webb (bwebb@pasoroblesha.org; 805-674-4413 cell).

One last comment- I did not get to read the document and I completely understand the growers' concerns, but if anything they are best avenue for hosting pop-up testing sites. The workers trust them, their employers more than they trust us or a third party. Maybe the growers are mostly concerned of what can happen if a good number of their employees test positive.

- 2. Request input from growers on availability of testing for their staff; coordinate to provide pop up testing at worksite, housing location or nearby community location.

 - b. Med/Health will coordinate testing locations

I have been having a number of conversations over the past few days with the ag industry. Here is a summary of what I have learne:

- 1. By law all employers are required to provide 3 days of sick leave to their employees, including farm labor. Since COVID arrived, farm labor has been provided 14 days of sick leave (based on certain criteria) for business with 500 or fewer employees under federal law. State law requires employers to provide 14 days of sick leave for farm labor where there are 500 or more employees. So, farm labor is protected just as other workers are.
- 2. From my conversations with the industry, it is a mixed bag related to testing. Some would welcome more testing, while others would rather see more information about testing. The additional information they would like to see is:
 - a. The type of testing available
 - b. The accuracy of the testing
 - c. The criteria for testing
 - d. Locations for testing
 - e. Hours of operation
 - f. Directory of local resources clinics, home health care, on-site testing, telemedicine.

I think it would be beneficial to provide some outreach specific to the ag community outlining this information. If additional testing were to be provided (pop up testing), I think we would want to do something in South County, SLO and North County. I know North County seems to have a higher concentration of positive tests, so it may be a good idea to do it up there.

- 3. Most of our fieldworkers are already here. Most of the individuals are year round laborers and the only influx is our guest laborers being brought in under the H2A program and that has already happened. So, there should not be a significant influx of farm labor past this point. In the fall, we may see a shift of labor to wine grapes and away from row crops or we may see a decline in numbers.
- 4. I have spoken with Kelly V. and the information I sent you yesterday regarding fieldworker guidance should be posted in the agriculture portion on ReadySLO.org.

I will be giving an update at the press briefing on Wednesday and I don't plan to address any of these issues specifically as it seems it would be premature. I will however provide information about the 54,000 masks we have to distribute. Basically, I will be providing the same information that was in my article you reviewed last week.

Please let me know if I missed any information you need or if we can help in any way. We are standing by.

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I have been having a number of conversations over the past few days with the ag industry. Here is a summary of what I have learne:

- 1. By law all employers are required to provide 3 days of sick leave to their employees, including farm labor. Since COVID arrived, farm labor has been provided 14 days of sick leave (based on certain criteria) for business with 500 or fewer employees under federal law. State law requires employers to provide 14 days of sick leave for farm labor where there are 500 or more employees. So, farm labor is protected just as other workers are.
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 - a. The type of testing available
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I think it would be beneficial to provide some outreach specific to the ag community outlining this information. If additional testing were to be provided (pop up testing), I think we would want to do something in South County, SLO and North County. I know North County seems to have a higher concentration of positive tests, so it may be a good idea to do it up there.

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- 4. I have spoken with Kelly V. and the information I sent you yesterday regarding fieldworker guidance should be posted in the agriculture portion on ReadySLO.org.

I will be giving an update at the press briefing on Wednesday and I don't plan to address any of these issues specifically as it seems it would be premature. I will however provide information about the 54,000 masks we have to distribute. Basically, I will be providing the same information that was in my article you reviewed last week.

Please let me know if I missed any information you need or if we can help in any way. We are standing by.

Penny,

I have been reaching out to various contacts regarding benefits for farm labor. There is a mandatory 14 days of Employer Paid Sick Leave for farmworkers. Additionally, there is a program, similar to FMLA, that becomes active after 30 days of employment. So, that being said, there is a cushion for farmworkers if they become sick due to COVID. Also, I am hearing from some of our larger growers, who hire and retain their own labor, that they have established a means to isolate workers should they become infected. I can't say that this is across the board, but it there has been some proactive actions taken by some growers.

So far, I am hearing that more testing would be welcome and we have been offered a site at the Farm Bureau office in SLO. I know we would need one in south county as well, as that is the highest concentration of farmworkers. One thing to keep in mind is that these testing sites would have to be flexible to accommodate the schedule of farmworkers such as being open early, late and possibly on weekends. I will dig deeper and have more info for you soon.

Most of us in Med/Health spoke with Marty this morning as a follow up to our last call. We propose the following COVID Migrant Worker Plan:

- 1. Develop information on COVID testing for Ag Dept to distribute to growers associations
 - a. PIO developing today and will send to Marty for input.
 - b. Marty will distribute to grower associate email list, post on website and PIOs will post on ReadySLO
- 2. Request input from growers on availability of testing for their staff; coordinate to provide pop up testing at worksite, housing location or nearby community location.
 - a. Marty will provide grower feedback to Med/Health
 - b. Med/Health will coordinate testing locations
- 3. With approval from EOC, offer County motel program to ag growers for use if they have workers that need to be quarantined or isolated and is unable to do so in current housing.
 - a. If approved, Med/Health will develop process instructions (similar to homeless process) for Marty to distribute to growers

At this point, most of the ag workers are working in South County. Come fall, the work will shift to SLO and North County for grape harvest.

Most of us in Med/Health spoke with Marty this morning as a follow up to our last call. We propose the following COVID Migrant Worker Plan:

1. Develop information on COVID testing for Ag Dept to distribute to growers associations

- a. PIO developing today and will send to Marty for input.
- b. Marty will distribute to grower associate email list, post on website and PIOs will post on ReadySLO
- 2. Request input from growers on availability of testing for their staff; coordinate to provide pop up testing at worksite, housing location or nearby community location.
 - a. Marty will provide grower feedback to Med/Health
 - b. Med/Health will coordinate testing locations
- 3. With approval from EOC, offer County motel program to ag growers for use if they have workers that need to be quarantined or isolated and is unable to do so in current housing.
 - a. If approved, Med/Health will develop process instructions (similar to homeless process) for Marty to distribute to growers

At this point, most of the ag workers are working in South County. Come fall, the work will shift to SLO and North County for grape harvest.

I have been having a number of conversations over the past few days with the ag industry. Here is a summary of what I have learne:

- 1. By law all employers are required to provide 3 days of sick leave to their employees, including farm labor. Since COVID arrived, farm labor has been provided 14 days of sick leave (based on certain criteria) for business with 500 or fewer employees under federal law. State law requires employers to provide 14 days of sick leave for farm labor where there are 500 or more employees. So, farm labor is protected just as other workers are.
- 2. From my conversations with the industry, it is a mixed bag related to testing. Some would welcome more testing, while others would rather see more information about testing. The additional information they would like to see is:
 - a. The type of testing available
 - b. The accuracy of the testing
 - c. The criteria for testing
 - d. Locations for testing
 - e. Hours of operation
 - f. Directory of local resources clinics, home health care, on-site testing, telemedicine.

I think it would be beneficial to provide some outreach specific to the ag community outlining this information. If additional testing were to be provided (pop up testing), I think we would want to do something in South County, SLO and North County. I know North County seems to have a higher concentration of positive tests, so it may be a good idea to do it up there.

- 3. Most of our fieldworkers are already here. Most of the individuals are year round laborers and the only influx is our guest laborers being brought in under the H2A program and that has already happened. So, there should not be a significant influx of farm labor past this point. In the fall, we may see a shift of labor to wine grapes and away from row crops or we may see a decline in numbers.
- 4. I have spoken with Kelly V. and the information I sent you yesterday regarding fieldworker guidance should be posted in the agriculture portion on ReadySLO.org.

I will be giving an update at the press briefing on Wednesday and I don't plan to address any of these issues specifically as it seems it would be premature. I will however provide information about the 54,000 masks we have to distribute. Basically, I will be providing the same information that was in my article you reviewed last week.

Please let me know if I missed any information you need or if we can help in any way. We are standing by.

Proposed Process for Migrant Worker Testing and Sheltering

- 1. The Public Health Nurse and/or case investigator, will conduct a case investigation for patients that test positive for COVID.
- If the patient, does not feel able to isolate in their normal living situation, the <u>Public Health</u> <u>nurse will contact the</u> Lodging Coordinator, (805-781-1061) or Sharon Lovelady (805-781-4857).
- 3. The Lodging Coordinator will work with the patient's employer to determine who will pay for the patient's lodging. Employer may use the County's motel contract to house patient but will take over payment of motel. If employer is unable to pay for lodging, Lodging Coordinator will determine if patient is eligible for County lodging programs: either homeless lodging or Project Room Key.
- 4. The Lodging Coordinator will start the process already established at the EOC. Food and regular checks by Public Health Nurses and Behavioral Health.
- 5. Lodging Coordinator will notify Homeless Services Team for possible case management.
- If meals need to be provided the lodging coordinator will confirm food delivery for new guest (dietary restrictions, medications, and other Important information).

Transportation Process if Necessary

- 1. Lodging Coordinator will contact the Hotel in the geographic area that the individual lives.
- 2. Lodging Coordinator will notify the Transport Driver if the guest has any mobility issues that would require accommodations.
- 3. Transportation driver will transport guest to the hotel with limited property (up to 2 bags).
- 4. Transportation Driver will complete all forms and return to Sharon Lovelady.
- 5. The individual should understand that placement in the Hotel means that he or she must stay in the Hotel until cleared from isolation.

Daily Medical Checks

- 1. Public Health Nurse will have a face to face visit or phone call with the guest.
- 2. Public Health Nurse will call Lodging Coordinator with updates.
- 3. Lodging Coordinator will update the Access Tracker.
- 4. If Case management is needed, they will contact each guest three times per day.
 - a. If a guest does not respond a call to the Hotel staff will be made to do a welfare check.
- 5. Lodging coordinator will process and enter all documents from check in procedure.
- 6. Lodging Coordinator will provide Dr. Rosen, Sheriff, Christine Gaiger with occupancy list of current guest's and guest's that will be discharged that day.

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Discharge Plan

- 1. Public Health Nurse will contact the Lodging Coordinator to start the discharge plan when the guest is all clear.
- 2. Lodging Coordinator will contact the Hotel to notify of guest being checked out.
- 3. Lodging Coordinator will contact the transportation staff to arrange pick up from Hotel back to where they were transported from.
- 4. Transportation staff will complete the discharge checklist.
- 5. After release, the participant will be provided transportation back to the location they were originally picked up from.

Most of us in Med/Health spoke with Marty this morning as a follow up to our last call. We propose the following COVID Migrant Worker Plan:

- 1. Develop information on COVID testing for Ag Dept to distribute to growers associations
 - a. PIO developing today and will send to Marty for input.
 - b. Marty will distribute to grower associate email list, post on website and PIOs will post on ReadySLO
- 2. Request input from growers on availability of testing for their staff; coordinate to provide pop up testing at worksite, housing location or nearby community location.
 - a. Marty will provide grower feedback to Med/Health
 - b. Med/Health will coordinate testing locations
- 3. With approval from EOC, offer County motel program to ag growers for use if they have workers that need to be quarantined or isolated and is unable to do so in current housing.
 - a. If approved, Med/Health will develop process instructions (similar to homeless process) for Marty to distribute to growers

At this point, most of the ag workers are working in South County. Come fall, the work will shift to SLO and North County for grape harvest.

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 - a. The type of testing available
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I think it would be beneficial to provide some outreach specific to the ag community outlining this information. If additional testing were to be provided (pop up testing), I think we would want to do something in South County, SLO and North County. I know North County seems to have a higher concentration of positive tests, so it may be a good idea to do it up there.

- 3. Most of our fieldworkers are already here. Most of the individuals are year round laborers and the only influx is our guest laborers being brought in under the H2A program and that has already happened. So, there should not be a significant influx of farm labor past this point. In the fall, we may see a shift of labor to wine grapes and away from row crops or we may see a decline in numbers.
- 4. I have spoken with Kelly V. and the information I sent you yesterday regarding fieldworker guidance should be posted in the agriculture portion on ReadySLO.org.

I will be giving an update at the press briefing on Wednesday and I don't plan to address any of these issues specifically as it seems it would be premature. I will however provide information about the 54,000 masks we have to distribute. Basically, I will be providing the same information that was in my article you reviewed last week.

Please let me know if I missed any information you need or if we can help in any way. We are standing by.

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Proposed Process for Migrant Worker Testing and Sheltering

- The Public Health Nurse and/or <u>case investigator</u> will <u>conduct a case investigation for patients</u> that test positive for COVID.
- If the patient, does not feel able to isolate in their normal living situation, the <u>Public Health</u> nurse will contact the Lodging Coordinator, (805-781-1061) or Sharon Lovelady (805-781-4857).
- 3. The Lodging Coordinator will work with the patient's employer to determine who will pay for the patient's lodging. Employer may use the County's motel contract to house patient but will take over payment of motel. If employer is unable to pay for lodging, Lodging Coordinator will determine if patient is eligible for County lodging programs: either homeless lodging or Project Room Key.
- 4. Lodging Coordinator will meet patient (and employer) and motel for check in. Patient will be provided phone number for lodging assistance questions/support.

If meals need to be provided, the Lodging Coordinator will confirm food delivery for new guest (dietary restrictions, medications, and other Important information).

Transportation Process if Necessary

- 1. Lodging Coordinator will contact the Hotel in the geographic area that the individual lives.
- 2. Lodging Coordinator will notify the Transport Driver if the guest has any mobility issues that would require accommodations.
- 3. Transportation driver will transport guest to the hotel with limited property (up to 2 bags).
- 4. Transportation Driver will complete all forms and return to Sharon Lovelady.
- 5. The individual should understand that placement in the Hotel means that he or she must stay in the Hotel until cleared from isolation.

Daily Medical Checks

- 1. Public Health Nurse will have a face to face visit or phone call with the guest.

Penny,

I have been reaching out to various contacts regarding benefits for farm labor. There is a mandatory 14 days of Employer Paid Sick Leave for farmworkers. Additionally, there is a program, similar to FMLA, that becomes active after 30 days of employment. So, that being said, there is a cushion for farmworkers if they become sick due to COVID. Also, I am hearing from some of our larger growers, who hire and retain their own labor, that they have established a means to isolate workers should they become infected. I can't say that this is across the board, but it there has been some proactive actions taken by some growers.

So far, I am hearing that more testing would be welcome and we have been offered a site at the Farm Bureau office in SLO. I know we would need one in south county as well, as that is the highest concentration of farmworkers. One thing to keep in mind is that these testing sites would have to be flexible to accommodate the schedule of farmworkers such as being open early, late and possibly on weekends. I will dig deeper and have more info for you soon.

If the participant does not have a phone number, then attempt to obtain the phone number for someone who resides close to the participant.
- 3. The participant who gets swabbed is given a letter explaining what is going on and instructed to call public health at 781-5500 if they do not hear from Public Health within 48 hours.
- 4. The swabbed participant is instructed to isolate (avoid contact with other people). The participant is also provided with a mask or masks to wear if the participant must be around other people.
- 5. IF THE PARTICIPANT TESTS POSITIVE, then the participant is given the option of returning to his or her usual place of residence and instructions to isolate for 14 days from the start of symptoms.
- 6. If the participant does not feel able to isolate in their normal living situation, the Lodging Coordinator is contacted (805-781-1061) or Sharon Lovelady (805-781-4857).
- 7. The Lodging Coordinator will start the process already established at the EOC. Food and regular checks by Public Health Nurses and Behavioral Health.
- 8. Lodging Coordinator will notify Homeless Services Team for possible case management.
- 9. If meals need to be provided the lodging coordinator will confirm food delivery for new guest (dietary restrictions, medications, and other Important information).

Transportation Process if Necessary

- 1. Lodging Coordinator will contact the Hotel in the geographic area that the individual lives.
- 2. Lodging Coordinator will notify the Transport Driver if the guest has any mobility issues that would require accommodations.
- 3. Transportation driver will transport guest to the hotel with limited property (up to 2 bags).
- 4. Transportation Driver will complete all forms and return to Sharon Lovelady.
- 5. The individual should understand that placement in the Hotel means that he or she must stay in the Hotel until cleared from isolation.

Daily Medical Checks

- 1. Public Health Nurse will have a face to face visit or phone call with the guest.
- 2. Public Health Nurse will call Lodging Coordinator with updates.
- 3. Lodging Coordinator will update the Access Tracker.
- 4. If Case management is needed, they will contact each guest three times per day.
 - a. If a guest does not respond a call to the Hotel staff will be made to do a welfare check.
- 5. Lodging coordinator will process and enter all documents from check in procedure.
- 6. Lodging Coordinator will provide Dr. Rosen, Sheriff, Christine Gaiger with occupancy list of current guest's and guest's that will be discharged that day.

Discharge Plan

- 1. Public Health Nurse will contact the Lodging Coordinator to start the discharge plan when the guest is all clear.
- 2. Lodging Coordinator will contact the Hotel to notify of guest being checked out.
- 3. Lodging Coordinator will contact the transportation staff to arrange pick up from Hotel back to where they were transported from.
- 4. Transportation staff will complete the discharge checklist.
- 5. After release, the participant will be provided transportation back to the location they were originally picked up from.

Most of us in Med/Health spoke with Marty this morning as a follow up to our last call. We propose the following COVID Migrant Worker Plan:

- 1. Develop information on COVID testing for Ag Dept to distribute to growers associations
 - a. PIO developing today and will send to Marty for input.
 - Marty will distribute to grower associate email list, post on website and PIOs will post on ReadySLO
- 2. Request input from growers on availability of testing for their staff; coordinate to provide pop up testing at worksite, housing location or nearby community location.
 - a. Marty will provide grower feedback to Med/Health
 - b. Med/Health will coordinate testing locations
- 3. With approval from EOC, offer County motel program to ag growers for use if they have workers that need to be quarantined or isolated and is unable to do so in current housing.
 - a. If approved, Med/Health will develop process instructions (similar to homeless process) for Marty to distribute to growers

At this point, most of the ag workers are working in South County. Come fall, the work will shift to SLO and North County for grape harvest.

Hi Penny,

I have been having a number of conversations over the past few days with the ag industry. Here is a summary of what I have learne:

- 1. By law all employers are required to provide 3 days of sick leave to their employees, including farm labor. Since COVID arrived, farm labor has been provided 14 days of sick leave (based on certain criteria) for business with 500 or fewer employees under federal law. State law requires employers to provide 14 days of sick leave for farm labor where there are 500 or more employees. So, farm labor is protected just as other workers are.
- 2. From my conversations with the industry, it is a mixed bag related to testing. Some would welcome more testing, while others would rather see more information about testing. The additional information they would like to see is:
 - a. The type of testing available
 - b. The accuracy of the testing
 - c. The criteria for testing
 - d. Locations for testing
 - e. Hours of operation
 - f. Directory of local resources clinics, home health care, on-site testing, telemedicine.

I think it would be beneficial to provide some outreach specific to the ag community outlining this information. If additional testing were to be provided (pop up testing), I think we would want to do something in South County, SLO and North County. I know North County seems to have a higher concentration of positive tests, so it may be a good idea to do it up there.

- 3. Most of our fieldworkers are already here. Most of the individuals are year round laborers and the only influx is our guest laborers being brought in under the H2A program and that has already happened. So, there should not be a significant influx of farm labor past this point. In the fall, we may see a shift of labor to wine grapes and away from row crops or we may see a decline in numbers.
- 4. I have spoken with Kelly V. and the information I sent you yesterday regarding fieldworker guidance should be posted in the agriculture portion on ReadySLO.org.

I will be giving an update at the press briefing on Wednesday and I don't plan to address any of these issues specifically as it seems it would be premature. I will however provide information about the 54,000 masks we have to distribute. Basically, I will be providing the same information that was in my article you reviewed last week.

Please let me know if I missed any information you need or if we can help in any way. We are standing by.

Penny,

I have been reaching out to various contacts regarding benefits for farm labor. There is a mandatory 14 days of Employer Paid Sick Leave for farmworkers. Additionally, there is a program, similar to FMLA, that becomes active after 30 days of employment. So, that being said, there is a cushion for farmworkers if they become sick due to COVID. Also, I am hearing from some of our larger growers, who hire and retain their own labor, that they have established a means to isolate workers should they become infected. I can't say that this is across the board, but it there has been some proactive actions taken by some growers.

So far, I am hearing that more testing would be welcome and we have been offered a site at the Farm Bureau office in SLO. I know we would need one in south county as well, as that is the highest concentration of farmworkers. One thing to keep in mind is that these testing sites would have to be flexible to accommodate the schedule of farmworkers such as being open early, late and possibly on weekends. I will dig deeper and have more info for you soon.

I have been having a number of conversations over the past few days with the ag industry. Here is a summary of what I have learne:

- 1. By law all employers are required to provide 3 days of sick leave to their employees, including farm labor. Since COVID arrived, farm labor has been provided 14 days of sick leave (based on certain criteria) for business with 500 or fewer employees under federal law. State law requires employers to provide 14 days of sick leave for farm labor where there are 500 or more employees. So, farm labor is protected just as other workers are.
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I think it would be beneficial to provide some outreach specific to the ag community outlining this information. If additional testing were to be provided (pop up testing), I think we would want to do something in South County, SLO and North County. I know North County seems to have a higher concentration of positive tests, so it may be a good idea to do it up there.

- 2. From my conversations with the industry, it is a mixed bag related to testing. Some would welcome more testing, while others would rather see more information about testing. The additional information they would like to see is:
 - a. The type of testing available
 - b. The accuracy of the testing
 - c. The criteria for testing
 - d. Locations for testing
 - e. Hours of operation
 - f. Directory of local resources clinics, home health care, on-site testing, telemedicine.

I think it would be beneficial to provide some outreach specific to the ag community outlining this information. If additional testing were to be provided (pop up testing), I think we would want to do something in South County, SLO and North County. I know North County seems to have a higher concentration of positive tests, so it may be a good idea to do it up there.

- 3. Most of our fieldworkers are already here. Most of the individuals are year round laborers and the only influx is our guest laborers being brought in under the H2A program and that has already happened. So, there should not be a significant influx of farm labor past this point. In the fall, we may see a shift of labor to wine grapes and away from row crops or we may see a decline in numbers.
- 4. I have spoken with Kelly V. and the information I sent you yesterday regarding fieldworker guidance should be posted in the agriculture portion on ReadySLO.org.

I will be giving an update at the press briefing on Wednesday and I don't plan to address any of these issues specifically as it seems it would be premature. I will however provide information about the 54,000 masks we have to distribute. Basically, I will be providing the same information that was in my article you reviewed last week.

Please let me know if I missed any information you need or if we can help in any way. We are standing by.

Penny,

I have been reaching out to various contacts regarding benefits for farm labor. There is a mandatory 14 days of Employer Paid Sick Leave for farmworkers. Additionally, there is a program, similar to FMLA, that becomes active after 30 days of employment. So, that being said, there is a cushion for farmworkers if they become sick due to COVID. Also, I am hearing from some of our larger growers, who hire and retain their own labor, that they have established a means to isolate workers should they become infected. I can't say that this is across the board, but it there has been some proactive actions taken by some growers.

So far, I am hearing that more testing would be welcome and we have been offered a site at the Farm Bureau office in SLO. I know we would need one in south county as well, as that is the highest concentration of farmworkers. One thing to keep in mind is that these testing sites would have to be flexible to accommodate the schedule of farmworkers such as being open early, late and possibly on weekends. I will dig deeper and have more info for you soon.

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<u>Process for COVID-19 Testing on Homeless Persons – Hospital Emergency Room</u>

- 1. Hospital staff identifies a homeless patient as possibly symptomatic for COVID-19 and offers testing.
- 2. If the patient agrees to be tested, move to step 3, if the patient refuses testing, they are released, assuming that other emergent health issues have been addressed.
- 3. If a patient agrees to swabbing, then detailed contact information must be recorded for that individual. That should include the individual's phone number. A secondary phone number (e.g., for a close friend or family member). And the physical location where that individual lives. If the patient does not have a phone number, then attempt to obtain the phone number for someone who resides close to the patient.
- 4. The patient who gets swabbed is given a letter explaining what is going on and instructed to call 781-5500 if the patient does not hear from Public Health within 48 hours.
- 5. The swabbed patient is instructed to isolate (avoid contact with other people). The patient is also provided with a mask or masks to wear if the patient must be around other people.
- 6. Hospital notifies Public Health that the sample submitted is from a homeless person and provides the contact information obtained in step 3 above.
- 7. Public Health will reach out to the patient after the test result is received to notify them of the result.
- 8. IF THE PATIENT TESTS POSITIVE, then the patient is given the option of returning to his or her usual place of residence and will receive an Isolation Letter confining them to their normal sleeping location and instructions to isolate for 14 days from the start of symptoms.
- 9. If the patient does not feel able to isolate in their normal living situation, they should be given an Isolation Order and placed in a trailer at El Chorro Regional Park using the Lodging Coordinator process already established at the EOC. Food, laundry service, trash pickup, cell phone given if no phone for contacting individual for daily health check in, and security are provided at this location as well as regular checks by Public Health Nurses and Behavioral Health.
- 10. Lodging Coordinator will notify case manager of new guest.
- 11. Confirm food delivery for new guest (dietary restrictions, medications, and other Important information.
- 12. Laundry service to be scheduled.

Transportation Process

- 1. Lodging Coordinator calls the Park Ranger to notify there will be an individual in the park.
- 2. Lodging Coordinator notifies the Transport Driver if the guest has any mobility issues that would require accommodations.
- 3. Transportation driver will transport guest to Trailer with limited property (up to 2 bags).
- 4. Transportation Driver will take forms to the EOC for processing.
- 5. The patient should understand that placement in the trailer means that he or she must stay in the trailer until cleared from isolation.

Day 1 Medical Checks

- 1. Public Health Nurse will have a face to face visit with the trailer guest.
- 2. Public Health Nurse will call Lodging Coordinator with updates.
- 3. Lodging Coordinator will update case manager of guest's and trailer numbers.
- 4. Case manager will contact each guest three times per day.
 - a. If a guest does not respond a call to the security staff will be made to do a welfare check.
- 5. Lodging coordinator will process and enter all documents from check in procedure.
- 6. Lodging Coordinator will provide Dr. Rosen, Sheriff, Christine Gaiger with Isolation Orders and occupancy list of current guest's and guest's that will be discharged that day.
- 7. If the guest had a negative test they are discharged immediately. If the guest tested positive and is at least 7 days past onset of symptoms, is afebrile for 72 hours and symptoms have improved the discharge plan will start.

Discharge Plan

- 1. Public Health Nurse will contact the Lodging Coordinator to start the discharge plan when the guest is all clear.
- 2. Lodging Coordinator will contact the transportation staff to arrange pick up from trailer back to the shelter.
- 3. Transportation staff will complete the discharge checklist and destroy the isolation order.
- 4. After release from isolation, the patient will be provided transportation back to the city or community they were originally picked up from.

"EXHIBIT A"

ISOLATE IN HOTEL AGREEMENT

I, the undersigned, agree as follows:

- I am signing this Isolate In Hotel Agreement in conjunction with the Isolation Order ("Order") issued by County Health Officer Penny Borenstein allowing me to isolate pursuant to the Order in the following hotel: ("Hotel").
- I understand that my temporary housing and isolation at the Hotel is only available during the isolation period as set forth in the Order. I will leave the Hotel after the isolation period. I will take all of my personal property with me when I leave. Any personal property that is left in the Hotel is hereby deemed abandoned and may be disposed of by County or Hotel staff as they deem appropriate, in their sole discretion.
- The Hotel room is only for my use. I will not invite any other person to stay or visit with me in my room.
- I will isolate in my Hotel room in accordance with the Order. I will not leave the Hotel except with the approval of the case manager for my Hotel. I will allow access to my Hotel room at any time to Hotel employees or County staff upon request. If I refuse to allow access to my room, Hotel or County staff have the right to forcibly enter the room.
- I will refrain from directly speaking or making contact with any of the Hotel staff.
- I will not loiter in the Hotel.
- I will adhere to "Social Distancing" by staying at least 6 feet away from any person.
- I will not engage in or participate in any social gathering.
- · I will not share of any items food, personal hygiene items, clothing, blankets, medicine, or personal belongings of any kind
- I will not possess or use alcohol or drugs (illegal) while I am at the Hotel, with the exception of any prescribed medications. Prescribed medications will be reported to the case manager upon my arrival to the Hotel.
- I will not possess any weapons or other devices that could be used to cause harm to persons or property. If I have an item in my possession upon arrival, I will turn it over to the case manager for safe-keeping until my departure when it will be returned to me.
- I will comply with all check in procedures.
- I will not use foul language while at the Hotel. I will be respectful to all Hotel employees and any other guests.
- I will keep my Hotel room clean and dispose of waste properly.
- I will follow any directions issued to me by my case manager or Hotel employees.
- I will not sexually harass or engage in lewd conduct. I will not display inappropriate sexual behavior including possession of sexually explicit material. I will dress modestly and appropriately at all times, including shirt and footwear.
- I will not steal nor use other people's belongings.
- I will not damage or destroy the Hotel room or any furniture or property.
- I will not display any form of threatening behavior including violence toward others or myself. I will not have any physical contact with the employees or guests.
- I will not have an animal with me on site other than a service animal.
- IN CONSIDERATION OF BEING ALLOWED TO ISOLATE IN THE HOTEL, THE UNDERSIGNED HEREBY RELEASES, WAIVES AND DISCHARGES AND COVENANTS NOT TO SUE the County and the Hotel, their owners, officials, officers, employees and agents from any and all liability to the undersigned, his/her assigns, heirs and next of kin for any loss, damage, or claim therefore on account of injury to the person or property of the undersigned, whether caused by the negligent act or omission, including the passive and active negligence of those released herein, regarding the issuance and enforcement of the Order and my temporary housing/isolation at the Hotel.
- I have read and understand the above statements and am aware of the legal consequences of this agreement. If I violate any of the above, I may be immediately removed from the Hotel in the County's sole and absolute discretion. I understand that my removal from the Hotel doesn't relieve me of my obligations to isolate per the Order

COVID-19 ISOLATION HOTEL LODGING PROCEDURES

- Individual presents to an Organized Shelter/Warming Center for services
- If individual exhibits signs and or symptoms of potential COVID19 infection, the individual is segregated to a separate trailer at the shelter/warming center.
- A Lodging Coordinator is assigned to the individual. The Lodging Coordinator will:
 - Arrange Public Health screening/testing the following morning
 - Arrange Transportation from the shelter/warming center to an isolation hotel (or trailer at El Chorro Park).
 - Arrange subsistence needs (Food, Medicines, ETC.) for the duration of the individual's stay
- Public Health will arrive to shelter/warming center to evaluate the individual
 - There will be a pre-prepared Public Health Isolation Order for the Individual
 - If the individual does not meet the criteria for COVID19 investigation/isolation, the prepared Isolation Order will be destroyed and the Individual will be released to return to the shelter/warming center program participation.
 - If the Individual meets the criteria for COVID19 investigation/isolation, testing will be completed, the Isolation Order will be served, and the Individual will be transported to an isolation hotel/trailer with the Isolation Order posted on the door of the location.
 - If the Individual refuses testing and/or transportation to an isolation hotel/trailer, the individual will be detained by the Probation Transportation Officer and local Law Enforcement will be contacted for arrest and booking per violation of the Isolation Order.

- Transportation Officer will transport the Individual to an Isolation Hotel/Trailer as designated by the Lodging Coordinator.
 - Transportation Officer obtains Individual's agreement/signature on "Isolation in Hotel Agreement" (Exhibit A)
 - Transportation Officer posts Isolation Order on the Individual's room/trailer door
- Individual is expected to remain Isolated within their room/trailer
- Isolation Hotel/Trailer Security will monitor for compliance with Isolation Order
 - If Individual violates conditions of Isolation Order, Security will attempt to gain voluntary compliance
 - If Individual refuses to voluntarily comply, Local Law Enforcement will be contacted to conduct arrest and booking for violation of the Isolation Order as appropriate.
- Upon completion of COVID19 Testing of the Individual the following will occur
 - A positive test will result in the continued enforcement of the Isolation Order until the Individual is cleared by Public Health
 - A negative test result will not be determined until the following morning after the Public Health Nurse reevaluates the Individual and rules out a "False Negative" test result, the Isolation Order is in force and enforceable until removed by the Public Health Nurse. Once the negative result is confirmed and the Isolation Order removed, one of the following will occur:
 - If the Individual is compliant, he/she may be allowed to remain in the Isolation Hotel/Trailer until their original symptoms resolve.
 - If the Individual is non-compliant or wishes to leave, the individual will be offered a ride back to the location they had been originally transported from or they will be told they can (or must) leave the Isolation Hotel/Trailer by their own arranged transportation method (Foot, Pick up out front by family/friend, etc.)
- An Individual who has tested COVID19 negative and released from an Isolation Order who remains at the Isolation Hotel/Trailer and in any way violates the signed agreement (Exhibit A) or otherwise disturbs the peaceful enjoyment of the Hotel/Trailer will be told to immediately vacate. Refusal to do so will result in a call to Local Law Enforcement for resolution, including appropriate enforcement of PC602 as applicable.





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SUMMARY OF THE SLO COUNTY AG DEPARTMENT'S DIRECT OUTREACH TO LOCAL AG BUSINESSES AND FARM LABOR CONTRACTORS (June 10, 2020)

1. **QUESTION**: Do your employees know that they can get a free COVID test at Community Health Centers throughout SLO County?

RESPONSE: Responses were mixed. Well over half of the businesses contacted understood that COVID tests were widely available and felt that their employees were also aware of those tests. However, there was still a significant number of businesses contacted (roughly 40%) that were not aware of the testing and didn't think their employees were aware either. There weren't any easily identifiable trends, based on geography (e.g. North County vs South County based businesses) or ag industry sectors or business size, of which businesses were aware or unaware of testing availability.

ACTION ITEM FOR THE AG DEPARTMENT: Most businesses are aware of the testing availability, but many are not. We will take the next few weeks and do our best to distribute that information to both businesses and workers.

- Distribute brochures completed last week to growers and businesses via email and other online distribution methods.
- Provide hard copies to workers while we are in the field and conducting inspections and other work unrelated to COVID. We will print those brochures ourselves in-house.

POTENTIAL ACTION ITEM FOR OTHERS: In order to reach the workers directly, it would be really helpful to put together some kind of public awareness campaign on local Spanish language radio, if that is not already being conducted.

2. **QUESTION**: Would your employees be more likely to get tested if the County ran a free "pop-up" testing site at a local farm, vineyard, or other site on a pre-arranged day? If the answer is yes, do you have any ideas on a good location to hold that kind of testing event?

RESPONSE: Most businesses that we spoke to felt that many of the workers would get tested if there was a testing site that was convenient and that they were familiar with. For example, if you held a testing site near the same grocery stores, pharmacies, or doctor's office that these workers use on a routine basis, they would be more inclined to take advantage of that option. Interestingly, although I suppose not surprisingly, some businesses noted that it would be mostly females and children that would take advantage of the free testing and that you'd have a lower percentage of the male workers getting tested.

The most consistent message we received from businesses is that they do NOT want to host testing events at local farms or ranches. There are a lot of perception issues that could stem from those types of events that businesses had concerns about, such as the concern many of their workers would have by bringing "the government" on to their job sites, the sense that it would appear to be mandatory for all of their workers if the testing was done at a work location, etc.

There were a couple of exceptions to that response from businesses that would be interested in hosting a test site. I believe the reason for that is that they are in the nursery industry, which tends to employ a more stable, long-term work force. I will reach out to those two companies myself and get some details on how many

employees they have and if a pop-up testing event was held, would they be willing to open it up to other workers outside of their own employees?

ACTION ITEM FOR THE AG DEPARTMENT: Although most businesses were adamant that the testing sites do not take place on a local farm or ranch, there were a couple that welcomed that possibility. We will reach out to those businesses to obtain further information on the potential logistics of hosting an event.

POTENTIAL ACTION ITEM FOR OTHERS: Determine potential locations in North County for a possible pop-up testing site. Is there an Hispanic market or other local business that is used frequently by farm workers where a testing event could be held?

3. **QUESTION**: If one of your employee's contracts COVID, have you already made arrangements for a place that they can stay that is separated from their co-workers?

RESPONSE: Answers to this question varied greatly and tended to vary based on the size of the business. Large operations generally have made some pre-arrangements, smaller businesses had not, and were simply instructing any sick workers to self-quarantine at home.

It's important to realize that ag workers fall into a variety of different legal categories. One fairly commonly used program is the H2A visa. Under that program, the employer is sponsoring the employee and is legally required to provide housing, so these businesses have typically made some alternate housing arrangements in case they're needed. Those workers that are here under the H2A program tend to work in row crops or strawberries and are working for the larger companies, mostly located in the southern part of the county (and often with workers residing in Santa Barbara County).

Otherwise, the employees are typically responsible for their own housing. So, if they aren't here under the H2A program, then they would be living with family or other co-workers. These are the people who could have the most trouble isolating if they were to contract COVID-19, and they would not be likely to utilize the housing arrangements unless it was paid for by the County. Their employers would not generally be willing to pay for those accommodations either since they are not responsible for their living/housing situation under normal circumstances.

Since many of our agricultural workers reside in either Santa Barbara or Monterey County, I don't have a good sense of how much this housing program will be needed and/or utilized.

ACTION ITEM FOR THE AG DEPARTMENT: We will do our best to inform businesses and workers regarding the availability of housing for those sick with COVID utilizing the same methods discussed in #1. If there are any Spanish language public service announcements conducted, then it would be helpful to include information about this housing availability in that outreach campaign.

SUMMARY OF THE SLO COUNTY AG DEPARTMENT'S DIRECT OUTREACH TO LOCAL AG BUSINESSES AND FARM LABOR CONTRACTORS (June 10, 2020)

1. **QUESTION**: Do your employees know that they can get a free COVID test at Community Health Centers throughout SLO County?

RESPONSE: Responses were mixed. Well over half of the businesses contacted understood that COVID tests were widely available and felt that their employees were also aware of those tests. However, there was still a significant number of businesses contacted (roughly 40%) that were not aware of the testing and didn't think their employees were aware either. There weren't any easily identifiable trends, based on geography (e.g. North County vs South County based businesses) or ag industry sectors or business size, of which businesses were aware or unaware of testing availability.

ACTION ITEM FOR THE AG DEPARTMENT: Most businesses are aware of the testing availability, but many are not. We will take the next few weeks and do our best to distribute that information to both businesses and workers.

- Distribute brochures completed last week to growers and businesses via email and other online distribution methods.
- Provide hard copies to workers while we are in the field and conducting inspections and other work unrelated to COVID. We will print those brochures ourselves in-house.

POTENTIAL ACTION ITEM FOR OTHERS: In order to reach the workers directly, it would be really helpful to put together some kind of public awareness campaign on local Spanish language radio, if that is not already being conducted.

2. **QUESTION**: Would your employees be more likely to get tested if the County ran a free "pop-up" testing site at a local farm, vineyard, or other site on a pre-arranged day? If the answer is yes, do you have any ideas on a good location to hold that kind of testing event?

RESPONSE: Most businesses that we spoke to felt that many of the workers would get tested if there was a testing site that was convenient and that they were familiar with. For example, if you held a testing site near the same grocery stores, pharmacies, or doctor's office that these workers use on a routine basis, they would be more inclined to take advantage of that option. Interestingly, although I suppose not surprisingly, some businesses noted that it would be mostly females and children that would take advantage of the free testing and that you'd have a lower percentage of the male workers getting tested.

The most consistent message we received from businesses is that they do NOT want to host testing events at local farms or ranches. There are a lot of perception issues that could stem from those types of events that businesses had concerns about, such as the concern many of their workers would have by bringing "the government" on to their job sites, the sense that it would appear to be mandatory for all of their workers if the testing was done at a work location, etc.

There were a couple of exceptions to that response from businesses that would be interested in hosting a test site. I believe the reason for that is that they are in the nursery industry, which tends to employ a more stable, long-term work force. I will reach out to those two companies myself and get some details on how many

employees they have and if a pop-up testing event was held, would they be willing to open it up to other workers outside of their own employees?

ACTION ITEM FOR THE AG DEPARTMENT: Although most businesses were adamant that the testing sites do not take place on a local farm or ranch, there were a couple that welcomed that possibility. We will reach out to those businesses to obtain further information on the potential logistics of hosting an event.

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3. **QUESTION**: If one of your employee's contracts COVID, have you already made arrangements for a place that they can stay that is separated from their co-workers?

RESPONSE: Answers to this question varied greatly and tended to vary based on the size of the business. Large operations generally have made some pre-arrangements, smaller businesses had not, and were simply instructing any sick workers to self-quarantine at home.

It's important to realize that ag workers fall into a variety of different legal categories. One fairly commonly used program is the H2A visa. Under that program, the employer is sponsoring the employee and is legally required to provide housing, so these businesses have typically made some alternate housing arrangements in case they're needed. Those workers that are here under the H2A program tend to work in row crops or strawberries and are working for the larger companies, mostly located in the southern part of the county (and often with workers residing in Santa Barbara County).

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Since many of our agricultural workers reside in either Santa Barbara or Monterey County, I don't have a good sense of how much this housing program will be needed and/or utilized.

ACTION ITEM FOR THE AG DEPARTMENT: We will do our best to inform businesses and workers regarding the availability of housing for those sick with COVID utilizing the same methods discussed in #1. If there are any Spanish language public service announcements conducted, then it would be helpful to include information about this housing availability in that outreach campaign.

Most of us in Med/Health spoke with Marty this morning as a follow up to our last call. We propose the following COVID Migrant Worker Plan:

- 1. Develop information on COVID testing for Ag Dept to distribute to growers associations
 - a. PIO developing today and will send to Marty for input.
 - b. Marty will distribute to grower associate email list, post on website and PIOs will post on ReadySLO
- 2. Request input from growers on availability of testing for their staff; coordinate to provide pop up testing at worksite, housing location or nearby community location.
 - a. Marty will provide grower feedback to Med/Health
 - b. Med/Health will coordinate testing locations
- 3. With approval from EOC, offer County motel program to ag growers for use if they have workers that need to be quarantined or isolated and is unable to do so in current housing.
 - a. If approved, Med/Health will develop process instructions (similar to homeless process) for Marty to distribute to growers

At this point, most of the ag workers are working in South County. Come fall, the work will shift to SLO and North County for grape harvest.

Hi Penny,

I have been having a number of conversations over the past few days with the ag industry. Here is a summary of what I have learne:

- 1. By law all employers are required to provide 3 days of sick leave to their employees, including farm labor. Since COVID arrived, farm labor has been provided 14 days of sick leave (based on certain criteria) for business with 500 or fewer employees under federal law. State law requires employers to provide 14 days of sick leave for farm labor where there are 500 or more employees. So, farm labor is protected just as other workers are.
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 - e. Hours of operation
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I think it would be beneficial to provide some outreach specific to the ag community outlining this information. If additional testing were to be provided (pop up testing), I think we would want to do something in South County, SLO and North County. I know North County seems to have a higher concentration of positive tests, so it may be a good idea to do it up there.

- 3. Most of our fieldworkers are already here. Most of the individuals are year round laborers and the only influx is our guest laborers being brought in under the H2A program and that has already happened. So, there should not be a significant influx of farm labor past this point. In the fall, we may see a shift of labor to wine grapes and away from row crops or we may see a decline in numbers.
- 4. I have spoken with Kelly V. and the information I sent you yesterday regarding fieldworker guidance should be posted in the agriculture portion on ReadySLO.org.

I will be giving an update at the press briefing on Wednesday and I don't plan to address any of these issues specifically as it seems it would be premature. I will however provide information about the 54,000 masks we have to distribute. Basically, I will be providing the same information that was in my article you reviewed last week.

Please let me know if I missed any information you need or if we can help in any way. We are standing by.

I have been reaching out to various contacts regarding benefits for farm labor. There is a mandatory 14 days of Employer Paid Sick Leave for farmworkers. Additionally, there is a program, similar to FMLA, that becomes active after 30 days of employment. So, that being said, there is a cushion for farmworkers if they become sick due to COVID. Also, I am hearing from some of our larger growers, who hire and retain their own labor, that they have established a means to isolate workers should they become infected. I can't say that this is across the board, but it there has been some proactive actions taken by some growers.

So far, I am hearing that more testing would be welcome and we have been offered a site at the Farm Bureau office in SLO. I know we would need one in south county as well, as that is the highest concentration of farmworkers. One thing to keep in mind is that these testing sites would have to be flexible to accommodate the schedule of farmworkers such as being open early, late and possibly on weekends. I will dig deeper and have more info for you soon.

Hi Penny,

I have been having a number of conversations over the past few days with the ag industry. Here is a summary of what I have learne:

- 1. By law all employers are required to provide 3 days of sick leave to their employees, including farm labor. Since COVID arrived, farm labor has been provided 14 days of sick leave (based on certain criteria) for business with 500 or fewer employees under federal law. State law requires employers to provide 14 days of sick leave for farm labor where there are 500 or more employees. So, farm labor is protected just as other workers are.
- 2. From my conversations with the industry, it is a mixed bag related to testing. Some would welcome more testing, while others would rather see more information about testing. The additional information they would like to see is:
 - a. The type of testing available
 - b. The accuracy of the testing
 - c. The criteria for testing
 - d. Locations for testing
 - e. Hours of operation
 - f. Directory of local resources clinics, home health care, on-site testing, telemedicine.

I think it would be beneficial to provide some outreach specific to the ag community outlining this information. If additional testing were to be provided (pop up testing), I think we would want to do something in South County, SLO and North County. I know North County seems to have a higher concentration of positive tests, so it may be a good idea to do it up there.

- 3. Most of our fieldworkers are already here. Most of the individuals are year round laborers and the only influx is our guest laborers being brought in under the H2A program and that has already happened. So, there should not be a significant influx of farm labor past this point. In the fall, we may see a shift of labor to wine grapes and away from row crops or we may see a decline in numbers.
- 4. I have spoken with Kelly V. and the information I sent you yesterday regarding fieldworker guidance should be posted in the agriculture portion on ReadySLO.org.

I will be giving an update at the press briefing on Wednesday and I don't plan to address any of these issues specifically as it seems it would be premature. I will however provide information about the 54,000 masks we have to distribute. Basically, I will be providing the same information that was in my article you reviewed last week.

Penny,

I have been reaching out to various contacts regarding benefits for farm labor. There is a mandatory 14 days of Employer Paid Sick Leave for farmworkers. Additionally, there is a program, similar to FMLA, that becomes active after 30 days of employment. So, that being said, there is a cushion for farmworkers if they become sick due to COVID. Also, I am hearing from some of our larger growers, who hire and retain their own labor, that they have established a means to isolate workers should they become infected. I can't say that this is across the board, but it there has been some proactive actions taken by some growers.

So far, I am hearing that more testing would be welcome and we have been offered a site at the Farm Bureau office in SLO. I know we would need one in south county as well, as that is the highest concentration of farmworkers. One thing to keep in mind is that these testing sites would have to be flexible to accommodate the schedule of farmworkers such as being open early, late and possibly on weekends. I will dig deeper and have more info for you soon.

SUMMARY OF THE SLO COUNTY AG DEPARTMENT'S DIRECT OUTREACH TO LOCAL AG BUSINESSES AND FARM LABOR CONTRACTORS (June 10, 2020)

1. **QUESTION**: Do your employees know that they can get a free COVID test at Community Health Centers throughout SLO County?

RESPONSE: Responses were mixed. Well over half of the businesses contacted understood that COVID tests were widely available and felt that their employees were also aware of those tests. However, there was still a significant number of businesses contacted (roughly 40%) that were not aware of the testing and didn't think their employees were aware either. There weren't any easily identifiable trends, based on geography (e.g. North County vs South County based businesses) or ag industry sectors or business size, of which businesses were aware or unaware of testing availability.

ACTION ITEM FOR THE AG DEPARTMENT: Most businesses are aware of the testing availability, but many are not. We will take the next few weeks and do our best to distribute that information to both businesses and workers.

- Distribute brochures completed last week to growers and businesses via email and other online distribution methods.
- Provide hard copies to workers while we are in the field and conducting inspections and other work unrelated to COVID. We will print those brochures ourselves in-house.

POTENTIAL ACTION ITEM FOR OTHERS: In order to reach the workers directly, it would be really helpful to put together some kind of public awareness campaign on local Spanish language radio, if that is not already being conducted.

2. **QUESTION**: Would your employees be more likely to get tested if the County ran a free "pop-up" testing site at a local farm, vineyard, or other site on a pre-arranged day? If the answer is yes, do you have any ideas on a good location to hold that kind of testing event?

RESPONSE: Most businesses that we spoke to felt that many of the workers would get tested if there was a testing site that was convenient and that they were familiar with. For example, if you held a testing site near the same grocery stores, pharmacies, or doctor's office that these workers use on a routine basis, they would be more inclined to take advantage of that option. Interestingly, although I suppose not surprisingly, some businesses noted that it would be mostly females and children that would take advantage of the free testing and that you'd have a lower percentage of the male workers getting tested.

The most consistent message we received from businesses is that they do NOT want to host testing events at local farms or ranches. There are a lot of perception issues that could stem from those types of events that businesses had concerns about, such as the concern many of their workers would have by bringing "the government" on to their job sites, the sense that it would appear to be mandatory for all of their workers if the testing was done at a work location, etc.

There were a couple of exceptions to that response from businesses that would be interested in hosting a test site. I believe the reason for that is that they are in the nursery industry, which tends to employ a more stable, long-term work force. I will reach out to those two companies myself and get some details on how many

employees they have and if a pop-up testing event was held, would they be willing to open it up to other workers outside of their own employees?

ACTION ITEM FOR THE AG DEPARTMENT: Although most businesses were adamant that the testing sites do not take place on a local farm or ranch, there were a couple that welcomed that possibility. We will reach out to those businesses to obtain further information on the potential logistics of hosting an event.

POTENTIAL ACTION ITEM FOR OTHERS: Determine potential locations in North County for a possible pop-up testing site. Is there an Hispanic market or other local business that is used frequently by farm workers where a testing event could be held?

3. **QUESTION**: If one of your employee's contracts COVID, have you already made arrangements for a place that they can stay that is separated from their co-workers?

RESPONSE: Answers to this question varied greatly and tended to vary based on the size of the business. Large operations generally have made some pre-arrangements, smaller businesses had not, and were simply instructing any sick workers to self-quarantine at home.

It's important to realize that ag workers fall into a variety of different legal categories. One fairly commonly used program is the H2A visa. Under that program, the employer is sponsoring the employee and is legally required to provide housing, so these businesses have typically made some alternate housing arrangements in case they're needed. Those workers that are here under the H2A program tend to work in row crops or strawberries and are working for the larger companies, mostly located in the southern part of the county (and often with workers residing in Santa Barbara County).

Otherwise, the employees are typically responsible for their own housing. So, if they aren't here under the H2A program, then they would be living with family or other co-workers. These are the people who could have the most trouble isolating if they were to contract COVID-19, and they would not be likely to utilize the housing arrangements unless it was paid for by the County. Their employers would not generally be willing to pay for those accommodations either since they are not responsible for their living/housing situation under normal circumstances.

Since many of our agricultural workers reside in either Santa Barbara or Monterey County, I don't have a good sense of how much this housing program will be needed and/or utilized.

ACTION ITEM FOR THE AG DEPARTMENT: We will do our best to inform businesses and workers regarding the availability of housing for those sick with COVID utilizing the same methods discussed in #1. If there are any Spanish language public service announcements conducted, then it would be helpful to include information about this housing availability in that outreach campaign.
